



Egypt Customs requests Advance Cargo Information, effective 16 October 2017

What is this all about?

Egypt Customs has announced recently that inbound shipments to the Arab Republic of Egypt must be submitted in advance, as of 16 October 2017, with a grace period of three months.

What do I need to do to comply?

Airline is to send information in advance for import, transit, and FROB shipments in advance of the flight arrival at destination (4 hours ahead of it for long haul flights / at flight departure for short haul flights). The source data are Master (MAWB), House Air Waybill (HAWB) and flight manifest information.

How can CHAMP help?

CHAMP offers a filing service that is compliant with Egypt Customs' mandatory requirements via its Traxon Global Customs (TGC) service.

What do I need to do to connect to TGC?

Carriers only need to send their FWB, FHL, FFM to the CHAMP TGC service on flight departure and TGC takes care of the rest – connecting to Customs, and filing the correct customs messages on time. You will need to provide flight schedule information to CHAMP but that is part of the TGC solution offering.
